# You are now eligible for a COVID vaccine if you meet any of these critieria:

- You are 60 or older
- You are a teacher, childcare worker, or work in a school\*
- You work in one of these areas: transit, grocery, utility, food and agriculture, sanitation, public works, or public health
- You live in low-income and affordable senior housing
- You have two of the health issues below:
  - Cancer
  - Chronic kidney disease
  - COPD
  - Down syndrome
  - Heart condition
  - Immunocompromised

- Obesity
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Smoking
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

\*March 27, April 3, April 10, and April 11 will be reserved for this group at the mass vaccination sites like the Eastfield Mall.



### TO MAKE A VACCINE APPOINTMENT:

- Go to the pre-registration site: http://bit.ly/COVIDVaccineApp
- Enter your information and register.
- Receive an email, text or phone call when an appointment is available.
- Appointments will be based on eligibility and location nearest to you.

Call 2-1-1 if you are age 75 and older, OR if you do not have access to the internet and need help scheduling an appointment.

Keep trying if you can't find an appointment!


### New Travel Advisory for the State of Massachusetts

If you travel out of Mass. for more than 24 hours, please quarantine for 10 days when you come back to Mass. No more Travel Order Forms!

#### You DON'T need to quarantine if:

- You were out of Mass. for less than 24 hours/1 day.
- You had a negative Covid-19 test 3 days before coming back to Mass.
- You are an essential worker going to and from work.
- You are fully vaccinated (2 weeks after the 2nd shot of Moderna or Pfizer or the 1 shot of Johnson & Johnson)

Who should get tested? You should get a test if: You develop *any* symptoms of COVID-19, even if they are mild *Or* you are a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19

- You should receive \$1,400 or \$2,800 for a couple
  - Plus \$1,400 for each dependent

# TAX PREP

We will not host a Tax Day event at our Viability office due to the safety concerns of COVID19. However, we are still connected to our local tax services and we will help you through their new process due to COVID19. Last day to file Taxes extended to May 17th!

If you have come to our previous Tax Day events and you need help filing your tax, **OR** if you are new and need to file your tax, please contact your Viability staff or contact us at

#### What Do You Need to File your Tax?

- Photo I.D. (for each person filing taxes)
- Your Social Security card
- Your spouse's Social Security card (if married)
- Social Security cards for all dependents.
- Proof of Health Insurance (letter)
- Tax Return 2019 if possible.
- 2020 W-2 Forms from all employers you worked for during the past tax year.
- 1099 Misc Forms if you (or your spouse) completed contract work and earned more than \$600.
- Income from local and state tax refunds from the prior year.
- Business income (accounting records for any business that you own)
- Unemployment income

- Rental property income
- Social Security benefits
- Miscellaneous income (including: jury duty, lottery and gambling winnings, Form 1099-MISC for prizes and awards, and Form 1099-MSA for distributions from medical savings accounts)

# **COVID-19 Screening and Appointment Rules**

Before we can see you in person for an ESSENTIAL (VERY IMPORTANT) appointment, we have to ask you some questions every time we meet in person: at the office or at your home.

**Question 1:** Have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the past 14 days?

Question 2: Has anyone in your household been diagnosed with COVID - 19 within the past 14 days? YES/NO

Question 3: Have you had a fever over 100 degrees, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache within the past 72 hours? YES/NO

Question 4: Have you or anyone in your household had the following: cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, abdominal pain, new muscle aches, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea within the past 72 hours? YES/NO

Question 5: Have you or anyone in your household traveled to any hot spots within the last 14 days where areas where a large number of COVID-19 cases have been confirmed? YES/NO

If you answered **NO** to all, then we can meet in person

BY APPOINTMENT ONLY.

# **Confirmed Appointment: Now What?**

We MUST do this when we meet in person at your home OR at office:

Maintain 6 ft at all times Wash or sanitize your hands upon entry exit of the building Sanitize or wash your hands frequently Wear a face mask or covering when while on-site speaking with people face-to-face, in the same room Only come at times agreed upon by Sanitize all surfaces that you utilize while on-site, including furniture, equipment, you and staff and come by yourself. Do not bring people writing utensils with you.
